The **Biju Yuba Sashaktikaran Yojana** (**Laptop DBT**) is a flagship initiative of the Odisha Government, aimed at encouraging digital literacy and empowering meritorious students by providing them with financial support to buy laptops. The scheme primarily targets students who have excelled in their 12th-grade board exams, supporting their higher education journey and fostering a culture of academic excellence.

Scheme Overview

The Biju Yuba Sashaktikaran Yojana was originally launched to distribute laptops to meritorious students. However, in recent years, the government has switched to a **Direct Benefit Transfer** (**DBT**) model, where the financial equivalent of a laptop is transferred to the beneficiary's bank account. This ensures transparency and allows students to purchase laptops of their choice.

Key Objectives

- **Promote Digital Literacy**: By providing laptops, the scheme aims to help students become proficient with technology and support their academic needs in a digital-first world.
- Encourage Academic Excellence: It rewards meritorious students, recognizing their hard work in the 12th-grade board examinations.
- **Empower Economically Disadvantaged Students**: The scheme helps bridge the digital divide by making technology accessible to students from economically weaker sections.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the scheme, students must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Meritorious Performance:
 - The scheme targets students who have passed the Class 12 board exams with distinction from recognized boards like **Council of Higher Secondary Education (CHSE), Odisha**, or other recognized boards such as **CBSE** and **ICSE**.
 - Typically, the top 15,000 students are selected based on their merit, and cut-off percentages may be set each year.
- 2. Odisha Domicile:
 - The student must be a resident of Odisha.
- 3. Educational Institutions:
 - The student must have completed their 12th grade from a school affiliated with the **Council of Higher Secondary Education (CHSE)**, or other recognized boards.

Selection Process

- 1. Merit-Based Selection:
 - The selection process is automatic, with students who meet the academic criteria (usually a high percentage in their 12th-grade exams) being shortlisted for the scheme.
- 2. No Separate Application:
 - Students do not need to apply separately. The eligible candidates are chosen based on their board exam performance.
- 3. Notification and Verification:
 - Selected students are notified, and they must ensure that their personal details, such as bank accounts, are correctly provided for the DBT transfer.

DBT Model (Direct Benefit Transfer)

- 1. Fund Transfer:
 - Under the DBT system, instead of directly receiving laptops, the selected students receive an amount credited to their bank accounts, typically between ₹25,000 and ₹30,000. This amount is intended for the purchase of laptops.
- 2. Purchase of Laptop:
 - Students are free to purchase a laptop of their choice, giving them flexibility in selecting a device that best suits their educational needs.
- 3. Transparency and Flexibility:

• The DBT model ensures that funds are directly transferred to the students, reducing any possibility of corruption or middlemen issues. It also allows students to pick laptops based on their specific academic and personal requirements.

Number of Beneficiaries

• Each year, **15,000** students are selected under the scheme. However, the number of beneficiaries may vary slightly based on government policies.

Important Dates

• The list of selected students and the distribution of benefits are usually announced after the declaration of Class 12 results. The timing of fund transfers varies, and notifications are sent to students.

Categories of Students

The merit list includes students from various streams:

a) Arts b) Science c) Commerce d) Vocational studies

The government ensures fair representation across all streams, allowing students from diverse academic backgrounds to benefit from the scheme.

Steps to Check Eligibility & Beneficiary Status

- 1. Visit the official Student Academic Management System (SAMS) or the CHSE Odisha website.
- 2. Look for the **Biju Yuba Sashaktikaran Yojana Laptop Distribution** link.
- 3. Input your details (like roll number) to check your status.
- 4. Ensure your bank details are up-to-date for the DBT transfer.

Documents required (for verification)

- 1. Class 12 Marksheet: To confirm academic performance.
- 2. Bank Account Details: For DBT transfer.
- 3. Domicile Certificate: To confirm residency in Odisha.
- 4. Aadhaar Card or ID Proof: For identification purposes.

Implementation and Monitoring

The scheme is implemented by the Department of Electronics & Information Technology, Government of Odisha, and the Higher Education Department of Odisha monitors the selection and distribution process. The funds are transferred through **Public Financial Management System (PFMS)**, ensuring accountability and transparency.

Impact of the Scheme

- The Biju Yuba Sashaktikaran Yojana has significantly contributed to the **digital empowerment of youth** in Odisha, particularly from rural and economically weaker sections.
- By equipping students with laptops, the government is encouraging **e-learning**, especially vital in today's educational landscape where online learning is crucial.
